CARYMOOR ENVIRONMENTAL TRUST – THE STONE AGE EXPERIENCE

Tuesday 19th November 2019

The children from BFG and Wild Thing's will be visiting Carymoor Environmental Trust to experience life in Stone Age Britain! They will hone their hunting skills, learn about ancient fire-lighting techniques, get creative with natural materials and forage for a stone age 'feast'- will their wild harvest feed or kill you?! They will end the day with a wild boar 'hunt' Carymoor-style!

Parents are asked to make a voluntary contribution of £13.50 per child via their Parentpay account to cover the cost of the trip. The children will travel by coach accompanied by Mrs Slade, Mrs Anderson, Mrs Jefferys, Mrs Morgan and two additional staff members, we will be leaving Rode School at 9:15 and returning in time for normal pick up arrangements. THREAD WORM

tract/threadworms

Threadworms, also known as pinworms, are tiny parasitic worms that infect the large intestine of humans. Threadworms are a common type of worm infection particularly in children under the age of 10. Please be vigilant as we have had reports that they are unwelcome visitors in school this term.

The worms are white and look like small pieces of thread. You may notice them around your child's bottom or in their poo. They don't always cause symptoms, but people often experience itchiness around their bottom.
