Message from Mrs Muxworthy

This week there has been a lovely sense of 'business as usual' about school and we are starting to make exciting plans for a hopefully Covid-free future.

What are we learning next week in our 'Far, Far Away' topic?

In **Gruffalo** Class we will be bird spotting and learning to identify garden birds. In Forest School we will try building a nest with a clothes peg as our beak after looking at the book 'The Best Nest. In Maths we will be adding eggs and partitioning eggs between two nests. Numbers of the week will be 18 and 19. We will be drawing birds and making 3D birds. Outside we will build a Bird Spotter's hide and use binoculars. As fact finders we will write our own non-fiction fact books about birds. Our book of the week will be 'The Ferry Birds' by Helen Dunsmore and our new sound will be 'ure'. In P.E we will complete our 'Little Bird' dance.

In **Elmer** class we will be using the story Finn MacCool and the Giants Causeway to inspire our writing. We will discover the legend behind the Giant's Causeway in Northern Ireland and use the pictures to retell it in our own words. In Maths we will continue to count in 2s, 5s and 10s and think about the patterns we notice when we count in those groups. We will also be thinking about measuring weight (mass). We will learn how to use balance scales to compare the weight of 2 objects and use the vocabulary heaviest and lightest to explain our findings. We will also carry out practical investigations to answer problems involving weight (mass.) During our spelling and phonics lessons we will continue to learn how to spell tricky words and we will be sound detectives and discover the different spelling choices for the phoneme 'ear.' In dance we will be continuing our Scottish dancing!

In **Paddington** Class we will 'meet' Major Tim Peake (the first British Astronaut in Space for 20 years!) and discover if we've really got what it takes to become an Astronaut. We will read some of his diary extracts, 'a day in the life of an Astronaut' and then have a go at writing our own. How will it feel to float around in Space?

Will we be driving a super-fast Moon buggy or jumping somersaults on the Moon? Will we enjoy and prefer the tasty Space food or miss home cooked meals and restaurants/takeaways on Earth?

Watch out for our diary extracts as we will be sharing them with you at home. In **Art** this week we have loved splattering, splodging and flicking paint in the style of 'Jackson Pollock' (to be continued next week). Our next creative adventure will be to use watercolours and chalk pastel techniques to continue with our Galaxy paintings. In **History** we will be making a film! What did Armstrong and co. actually do on the Moon? Can we act, produce and narrate a film to explain what actually happened on the Moon? I've got my popcorn ready for the premier!!

In **Numeracy** we continue to look at shape, delving into 3 D shapes, identifying them and sorting them.

In **Wildthings** next week in Maths, the children will be starting a new topic on Fractions, so be prepared to have children craving cakes, pizzas and chocolate! In Literacy, the children will be continuing to explore their own Greek myth based on 'Theseus and the Minotaur'. We will be stretching, polishing and improving the writing many times to make a polished piece of writing that the children are really proud of. We will also continue our learning about the religion of Islam. In Science the children will be able to be really practical learning about electricity, making a circuit work with a bulb and a buzzer. We may need ear plugs for this bit!

In **BFG** this week we will start our work on Decimals. The children begin this by looking at tenths on a place value grid and a number line. The children will be using their skills of multiplying and dividing by 10 to make numbers larger and smaller.

In Literacy, the children have explored many Greek Myths. The children will use this to create and write their own myth using their own hero, supernatural God/Goddess, and mythical beast. Our focus will be on using fronted adverbials to show how/when an event occurs and expanded noun phrases to add detail and description and organising their writing into paragraphs.

The week of April 2nd-9th will see our trailblazing ('scuse the pun) nature trail with a twist. Called Chicks on Sticks (as in on branches) we're excited about this one. All the children across both sites will be designing and decorating a chick each, which will then be adorned in the lanes and paths around Rode and Norton St. Philip.
