Introduction:

At Rode and Norton St Philip Federation our Christian Vision is to ignite a creative spark; illuminating new possibilities, hidden potential, and big dreams, enabling each and every child to embark on a unique adventure towards life in all its fullness.

In 2020-21, following a year of Covid restrictions, we continued our focus on the previous year's targets: developing our Leaders at all levels of our Federation, ensuring all our pupils experience a creative, inclusive, and inspirational curriculum and that our buildings, organisation and environment enhance learning and enable the delivery of our Vision.
